



# Bodies in chorus. Towards a feminist-antiracist theory of political action

Raissa Wihby Ventura is a postdoctoral fellow at the State University of Campinas, as well as a visiting scholar in the Department of Cultural Studies at the University of Koblenz and in the Normative Orders Research Center at Goethe University Frankfurt.

Her research interests lie in contemporary political theory with a particular focus on the ethics of migration, epistemic injustices, feminist politics, and political action in contexts of oppression.

Who is the political subject that, by acting in chorus, both (a) indicates the limits of what is conventionally said about transformative political practice and (b) frays the defining plot of who can legitimately access the grammars of democratic political struggles? Driven by this question and drawing on the work of feminist-antiracist theories (S. Hartman, S. Carneiro, C. Evaristo, D. F. da Silva), Wihby Ventura intends to bring together the efforts of a theorization about the political action of those subjects rarely (re)presented (Spivak) as political agents.

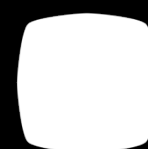
