

Interrogating Coloniality. Decolonial Feminism as Latin American Subaltern Feminism

Luciana Ballestrin is Professor of Political Science at Universidade Federal de Pelotas, Brazil, and editor of the *South American Political Science Review*. She researches and publishes on global, democratic and postcolonial political theory. In the last two decades, decolonial feminism has developed a critical discourse on modernity and coloniality inside and outside of Latin American feminism. In this presentation, I will propose an understanding of decolonial feminism as Latin American and subaltern feminism. Based on the interrelation between theory and practice in the decolonial feminist project, its originality is to articulate decolonization as a political utopia among Latin American subaltern feminisms. However, decolonial feminism also exposes the paradox of feminist representation when it rejects its own feminist project.
